a respected authority for high-ranking, high-profile, high-level women. Dee has coached the First Lady of Bermuda and the top women leaders of the country. Her client roster includes women in corporate, FBI, NCIS, those who bear titles of Chief Judge and Mayor as well as Ministry Leaders.
